City History

Hedwig Village was incorporated as a City by election in December 1954. Harris County Commissioners Court recorded the results of the election into their meeting minutes the same year. The City was named after Hedwig Schroeder, a long-time resident at the time of the election. The City park is also named in her honor. The City holds an election every year on the first Saturday in May. Mayor and Council Positions 1 and 5 are elected in odd-numbered years. Council Positions 2, 3, and 4 are elected in even-numbered years.

Communication

The City has an email notification system for fast communication with the residents. The link to sign up is on the homepage of the City's website.

Hedwig Village Police Department

The Hedwig Police Department is located at 9000 Gaylord. The department is operational all day, every day and fully staffed. Visit their webpage at www.hedwigtx.gov/page/police home.

Village Fire Department

The Village Fire Department is located at 901 Corbindale Road. The department was created in January 1979 by Inter-local Agreement between, and serves, all six Memorial Villages. Their website is www.villagefire.org.

Trash and Recycling Service

The City has contracted with Texas Pride to collect household trash and recycling within the residential districts of the City.

- The household trash collection days are Wednesday and Saturday.
- The collection day for recycling is Wednesday.
- Trash and recycling should be ready for pickup by 7:00 a.m. on the collection days. However, pickup can occur between 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- The City offers backdoor trash and recycling service. However, both trash and recycling must be visible from the street and NOT inside or behind a garage, fence, carport, gate, or building.
- Yard waste must be placed curbside and should not exceed 50 pounds. Tree limbs should be trimmed to no more than 4 foot in length and bundled.
- Construction debris, dirt, rocks, concrete, liquid paints, fuels, oils, fertilizer, pesticides, batteries, and tires will NOT be collected.

- Heavy/bulk trash is limited to 2 items per collection day and must be placed curbside.
- The list of acceptable recyclable items is available on the City's website or at - www.texaspridedisposal.com/recycle.

City Park

The City Park is located on Corbindale Road across the road from the fire station. The park has play areas for children, a covered pavilion, and picnic tables. The park can be reserved for gatherings, with restrictions, by Hedwig Village residents. Contact City Hall at 713-465-6009 to reserve the park.

Tree City USA

The City is now a recognized Tree City through the National Arbor Day Foundation's Tree City USA Program. The requirements to become a Tree City include having a City Ordinance protecting/caring for public trees, a Resolution recognizing Arbor Day, and having a Tree Advisory Board, among other requirements. The City Council approved the Public Tree Ordinance at the February 2023 Council Meeting. City Council also approved the Resolution recognizing Arbor Day at the February 2023 meeting. Texas recognizes Arbor Day on the first Friday in November every year.

Helpful Information

Burglar Alarm Registration

The City does require the registration of your burglar alarm system. See the City website for the form or for your convenience, a form is attached. This is an annual registration.

Dog Registration

The City does require your pet dog(s) to be registered. See the attached form or the City's website. Bring a current rabies vaccination record along

with the registration form and \$3.00 per dog. This is an annual registration.

Historical Marker

Visit the historical marker located at the corner of Piney Point Road and Gaylord Drive. The historical marker shares fun facts about the Spring Branch area.

Spring Branch Memorial Library

Voter Registration

The City of Hedwig Village holds its General Election on the first Saturday in May. In order to vote in the Hedwig Village elections, you must update your voter registration with your current Hedwig Village address. Your voter registration must be updated at least thirty (30) days before the election.

Car Stickers

Attached are vehicle stickers for two vehicles in your household. Stop by City Hall is you have more than two vehicles. The sticker has the City logo and should be placed on the rear window on the driver's side. Please remember to remove the sticker when you sell your vehicle.

Permits – Frequently Asked Questions

What are the common projects that require a permit?

Repair or replacement of a roof, fences, water heaters, or AC units.

Interior or exterior remodels that add or take away square footage from the original structure.

All remodels that will require relocating electrical, plumbing, or mechanical lines.

If removing a tree for any reason, a tree permit is required.

Applications are available on the City's website under the Construction tab.

What can I do without a permit?

Replacement of flooring, tile, cabinetry, paint and replace existing fixtures in their original location, such as sinks, toilets, faucets, electrical fixtures, and drywall.

When is the approval from Memorial Villages Water Authority required?

Any project that requires digging or trenching, such as sewer, drainage, swimming pools, or irrigation.

Can the city recommend a contractor?

No, we do not. However, we will require all contractors to comply with providing all credentials and to become registered with our city in order for them to serve our residents.

Should I go through the City of Houston to pull any type of permit?

No, all permits are processed and issued by the City of Hedwig Village.

A Proclamation of the City Council of the City of Hedwig Village, Texas Declaring Arbor Day

WHEREAS, in 1890 Texas established a special day to be set aside to encourage the planting of trees; and,

WHEREAS, Arbor Day is observed throughout the nation and the world; and,

WHEREAS, the official Arbor Day in Texas is held on the first Friday in November; and,

WHEREAS, trees are an important part of the history of the City of Hedwig Village as many of our trees predate the founding of our City in 1954; and,

WHEREAS, trees can be the solution to combating the reduction of the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cutting heating and cooling costs, cleaning the air, producing life-giving oxygen, and providing habitat for wildlife;

WHEREAS, trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community; and,

WHEREAS, trees - wherever they are planted - are a source of joy and spiritual renewal;

WHEREAS, all citizens are urged to celebrate Arbor Day and to support efforts to protect our trees and woodlands; and

WHEREAS, all citizens are urged to plant trees to gladden the heart and promote the well-being of this and future generations; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Hedwig Village, on behalf of all the citizens, do hereby proclaim, in the City of Hedwig Village, Texas

Becoming a Tree City

Opportunity: Establish Hedwig Village as a nationally recognized Tree City per standards at www.arborday.org/treecityusa.

Benefits:

Emphasizes the importance of trees to the City and its residents and businesses through participation in a national program.

- Trees are an important part of the history of Hedwig Village and some predate the city.
- The City has been planting trees since its founding.
- Trees help absorb the sounds of traffic in urban areas by 40%.
- Trees absorb and retain water 1 mature tree absorbs 2000 gallons of rainwater per year.
- · Neighborhoods with trees are seven to nine degrees cooler.
- Trees reduce energy costs up to 25% by shading buildings.
- · Homes with trees have higher property values.
- · Planting and maintaining trees absorbs carbon dioxide in the atmosphere

Provides for continuing attention to the health of trees in the city and an ongoing planting program.

Encourages community participation and education including recognition of state Arbor Day (1st Friday in November or November 3, 2023).

Requirements:

- 1. Have a Tree Advisory Board (TAB) that works with City Staff and is responsible for management of community's public trees.
- 2. Establish a tree ordinance that covers health of public trees and assigns care responsibility.

- 3. Budget minimum of \$2 per capita on urban forestry.
- 4. Recognize and celebrate Arbor Day.

Timeline:

February-March 2023 – draft and approve Ordinance. Create and staff tree advisory board. Submit application for Tree City designation.

April 2023 - hold 1st Tree Advisory Board meeting.

July - August 2023 - confirm annual tree budget during city budgeting process.

November 2023 - Publish city proclamation for Arbor Day.

Communications program:

- Showcase in city newsletter
- Signage at City Hall
- Information on city website
- Amendment to existing city welcome signage
- Flyer for new resident welcome packets. Include history of trees in the area, tree care and maintenance tips sheet, list of desired trees, and permit/fee information regarding tree removal processes.

Observations

- TAB will coordinate with the City Forester, Planning, Engineering, Public Works
- Distribution of tree tips and maintenance info, best trees for the area
- Arbor Day program proclamation, tree giveaway, educational speaker.
 Want to confirm timing relative to the city recycling day which is usually in September-October.

TREES COMBAT URBAN HEAT ISLAND EFFECT BY:

- Cooling temperatures by up to 10 degrees and providing relief from extreme heat
- Reflecting up to 90 percent of the sun's energy back into the atmosphere
- Shading homes and lowering electricity bills
- Lowering surface temperatures in parking lots by approximately 36 degrees



TREES IMPROVE WATER QUALITY BY:

- Absorbing 25 to 35 percent of rainfall and controlling flooding better than manmade systems
- Restricting stormwater runoff from reaching our waterways
- Filtering heavy metals and other pollutants



TREES ENHANCE AIR QUALITY BY:

- Lowering outdoor temperatures, which reduces energy consumption and the pollution it creates
- Capturing carbon emissions that lead to climate change. A single tree removes 22lbs of carbon per year
- Absorbing hundreds of thousands of metric tons of air pollution a year and replacing it with oxygen



TREES BUILD VIBRANT NEIGHBORHOODS BY:

- Inviting neighbors to go outdoors and connect with one another
- Reducing instances of vandalism, graffiti, and littering
- Lowering crime rates and acts of aggression
- Providing fruit to areas suffering from the effects of food deserts
- · Growing a sense of community



TREES BOOST COMMUNITY HEALTH AND HAPPINESS BY:

- Encouraging physical activity and spending time outdoors
